Target Audience

Girls ages 11 to 18 , pregnant or with their children. Most of them were victims of mistreatment or sexual abuse; lived on the street and used drugs, and have either none or very weak family ties.



Goals

- To guarantee the custody of their children;
- To prepare children and adolescents to return to their original families. When reintegration is not possible we prepare them for an autonomous and emancipated life;
- Breaking the poverty-violence virtuous circle, present in the family and social spaces, as well as early pregnancy .
- Strengthening ties between mother and child.

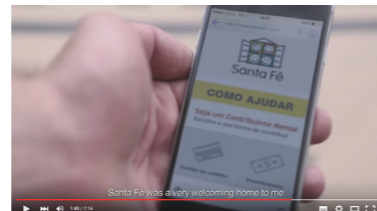
Social Action

The initiative designed by Lew' Lara TBWA agency addressed the invisibility of children living on the streets.



The work of Santa Fé was disclosed in an action directed at visitors of sculptor Ron Mueck's exhibition, at Pinacoteca do Estado de São Paulo. Making, a parallel with the works of the hyper-realistic artist, the action aimed to shed light on a reality much less visible, or even ignored by society: abandoned children afflicted by mistreatment, living on the streets of São Paulo.

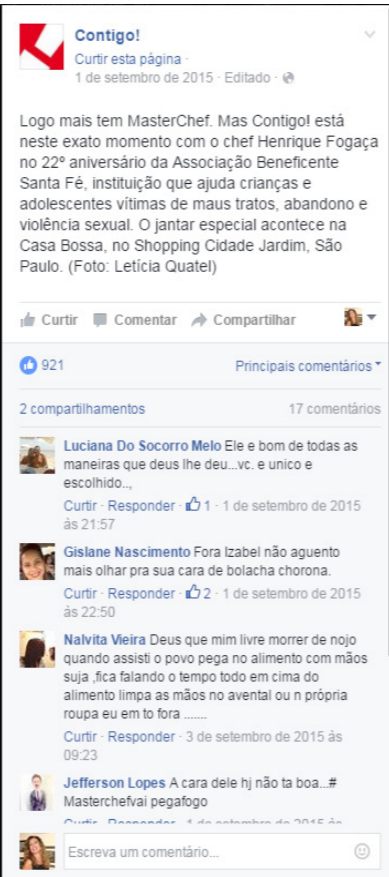

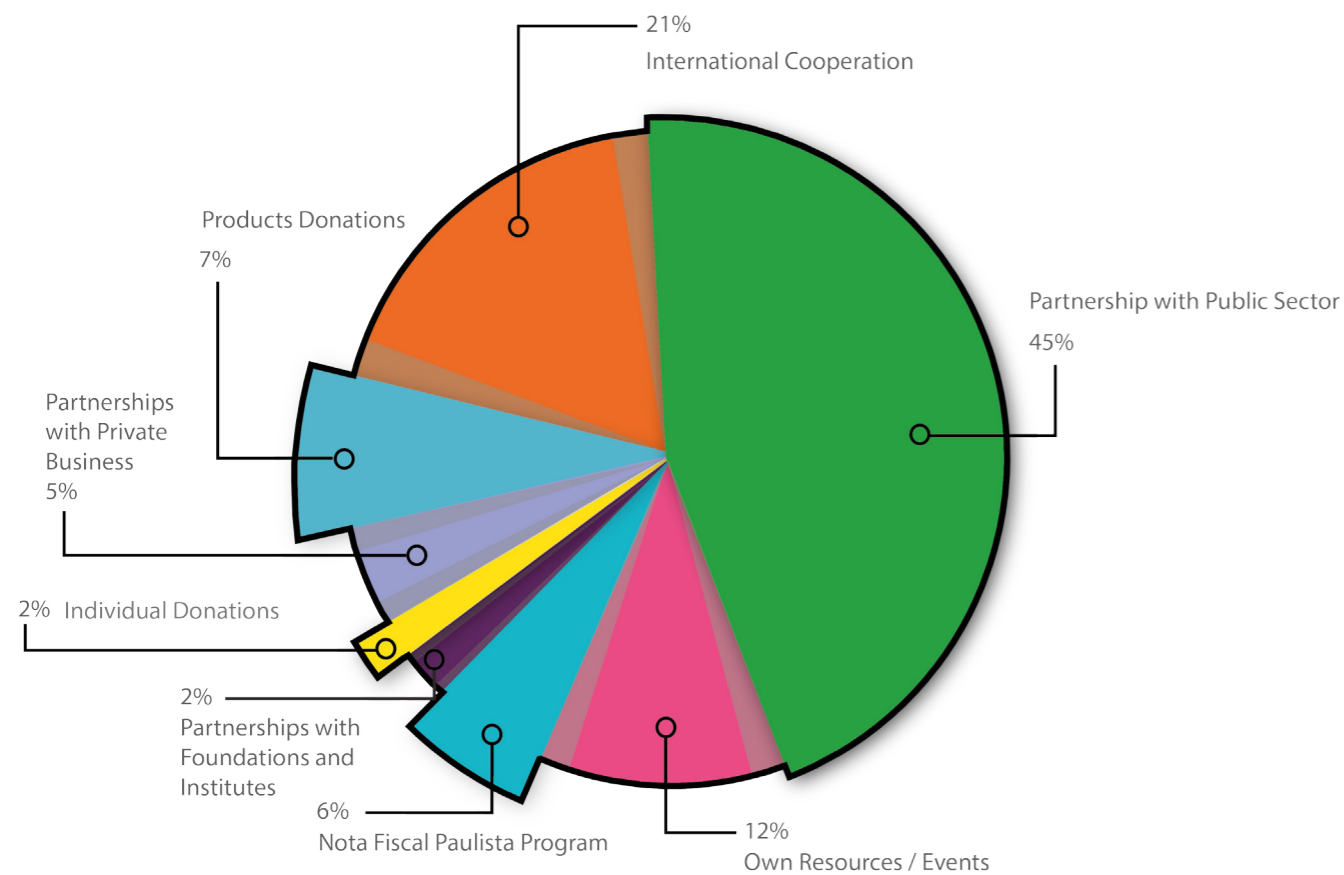
